DAILY READINGS

He Reigns – The book of Revelation is a mysterious, apocalyptic, incredible book which gives a continual glimpse of God reigning on a throne in perfect peace and sovereign leadership in contrast to the earth that is filled with chaos and heartache. This series will aim to show how God reigns in the midst of volatile times.

Before your reading each day, meditate on Revelation 19:6-7 , pray for one person to know Christ  and one person to grow in Him .

Memorization & Meditation:

“Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, “Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. Let us rejoice and exult and give him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready.” – Revelation 19:6-7

Sunday, November 1st

- [Nov. 2] Rev. 19:1-5 | What attributes of God lead you to worship?
- [3] Rev. 19:6-10 | The Bride can wear white because Jesus has conquered sin and His blood washes us clean. Use the words of this passage to spend time praising Jesus today, that he has saved & cleansed us as His Bride.
- [4] Rev. 19:11-17 | This is an incredible picture of our conquering King! What stands out to you most in this description of Jesus?
- [5] John 12:12-16 | Compare this scene to the triumphal return of Christ in Rev. 19 that we read yesterday. What differences do you see?
- [6] Rev 19:11-21 | When Christ comes in final victory, evil will be dealt a final death blow. How does this truth encourage you today?
- [7] Romans 8:31-39 | Keep the picture of Christ as conquering King in mind as you read that we too are more than conquerors in Christ! Ask the Lord to help you hide these truths in your heart and to apply them in any areas where you might be struggling today.

Sunday, November 8th

- [9] Rev. 20:1-15 | How do you think it would feel to stand in front of the book of life without the hope of the Gospel? Spend time today praying for those who don't yet have the assurance that their name is written in that book.
- [10] Rev. 21:1-4 | How do you practice communion with God now? How will it be different in eternity? How will it be similar?
- [11] Rev. 21:5-8 | Considering how difficult this year has been across the board, what comfort does it give you to know that one day, God will “make all things new”?
- [12] Colossians 3:1-2 | What is one thing about your life or ministry that can be changed to be more “heavenly minded” so your life can be more effective for “earthly good”?
- [13] 2 Peter 3:1-13 | How does the time in between Christ's first and second coming ultimately reflect His patience and mercy?
- [14] Isaiah 43:18-19 | Spend some time with the Lord today and share with Him some of the things that are heavy or broken in your life right now. Ask him to give you new hope for and comfort in these areas.

Sunday, November 15th

- [16] Rev. 21:9-21 | What stands out to you the most in this description of the New Jerusalem?
- [17] Rev. 21:22-27 | What does it mean that there is no temple, that the Lord God and the Lamb are the temple?
- [18] Rev. 22:1-5 | In what ways does this city look like the garden of Eden in Genesis? How is it different?
- [19] Rev. 22:1-5 | Why is seeing the face of God the greatest blessing of all in the new creation?
- [20] Isaiah 65:17-19 | This prophecy points to the new city God will bring someday. What are you most looking forward to about the new creation?
- [21] Rev. 21 & Rev. 22:1-5 | Search for and listen to “New Jerusalem” by Shane and Shane on YouTube.

Sunday, November 22nd

- [23] Rev. 22:6-11 | What good things in your life are you tempted to turn into objects of worship, like John worships the angel in this passage?
- [24] Rev. 22:12-21 | John is told to proclaim God's truth because the end is near. In light of this, who do you need to share the Gospel with? Spend some time praying and asking God to give you wisdom and insight in this area.
- [25] Rev. 1:7-8 | How do you think it will feel to an unbelieving world when Christ comes again?
- [26] Titus 2:12-13 | What does it look like for you to “wait well” on the coming of Christ?
- [27] 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 | How does this passage encourage you as a believer?
- [28] 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 | What does it look like to build one another up and encourage one another as we wait for Christ?

Sunday, November 29th

- [30] How has the Lord changed your view of the book of Revelation through this reading plan and sermon series? What have you learned?
