






## DAILY READINGS

Welcome to our June 2022 reading plan! We will be continuing in our series all about the Church – who we are as believers, what we should value, what we are called to in Christ. Each week we will be focusing on a different aspect. Before your reading each day, meditate on Colossians 1:17-18 , pray for one person to know Christ  and pray for one person to grow in Him .

### Memorization & Meditation:

*“And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent.” – Colossians 1:17-18*

### WEEK 1

- [June 1] 1 Corinthians 12:21-26 | What was God’s goal in the composition of the body? (v.25) Spend some time reflecting - do you look down on or judge people with certain spiritual gifts?
- [2] 1 Corinthians 12:27-31 | How do our differences bring us together as one body?
- [3] 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 | Why do you think this passage follows right after the texts on the body of Christ? Do you treat others with this kind of love – even if they are different from you?
- [4] What is something new that you learned about the Church this week? What is something you were reminded of? Something the Lord highlighted for you?

### WEEK 2

#### Sunday, June 5th

- [6] Colossians 3:12-17 | How does this passage call us to live differently from the world around us? Can you think of a time when you specifically chose humility and patience over a more natural response?
- [7] Ephesians 4:1-16 | Though we have different gifts, we are still united in one body. What is one way you could serve the body of Christ and contribute to the goal of unity?
- [8] Ephesians 4:17-32 | What has been one of the hardest things to “put off” from your old self as you walk in newness with Christ? Spend some time praying today and ask the Lord for breakthrough in this area!
- [9] Colossians 1:15-23 | What does it mean for Christ to be our “head”?
- [10] 1 Corinthians 14:1-40 | What do you think it means in v. 5 and 12 to “build up the church”? How have you used your spiritual gifting to build our church?
- [11] What is something new that you learned about the Church this week? What is something you were reminded of? Something the Lord highlighted for you?

### WEEK 3

#### Sunday, June 12th

- [13] Revelation 19:6-10 | Why do you think those who are invited to the Marriage Supper are blessed?
- [14] Ephesians 5:22-24 | What does it look like for us to submit to Christ?
- [15] Ephesians 5:25-3 | How does Christ’s sacrificial love benefit the Church? How has it blessed you personally?
- [16] Ephesians 5:1-32 | Why do you think a marriage is one of the pictures Paul chose to describe the relationship between Christ and the Church?

- [17] Revelation 21:1-27 | Why do you think the New Jerusalem is also described as the Bride of the Lamb?
- [18] What is something new that you learned about the Church this week? What is something you were reminded of? Something the Lord highlighted for you?

### WEEK 4

#### Sunday, June 19th

- [20] 2 Chronicles 6:40-7:3 | This is the moment Solomon dedicated the temple and invited the Presence of God to dwell there. What do you think the people who were there to witness it were feeling when fire fell from heaven? What would you be feeling?
- [21] 1 Corinthians 6:19 | How can we glorify God in our bodies?
- [22] John 2:17-22 | What is happening in this passage? Why does Jesus compare His body to the temple?
- [23] 1 Corinthians 3:1-17 | What sort of “work” are you doing for the Lord? What materials are you using? Are you making lasting investments or ones that will be burned up in the end? Reflect on this.
- [24] Ephesians 2:17-22 | Has becoming a believer given you the ability to love and connect with someone you would not normally connect with? What does it look like for us to be “built together” (v.22)?
- [25] What is something new that you learned about the Church this week? What is something you were reminded of? Something the Lord highlighted for you?

### WEEK 5

#### Sunday, June 26th

- [27] Matthew 5:14-16 | What does it look like for you practically to let your light shine before others in your daily life?
- [28] Psalm 119:105 | How can we use the Word of God as a lamp for our feet? Can you remember a time when scripture gave you guidance?
- [29] Ephesians 5:6-11 | What comes to mind when you hear the words “good and right and true”? Do you see that kind of fruit in your life and in the lives of the believers around you?
- [30] 1 John 1:5-10 | Jesus is always calling us out of the darkness and into the light. Re-read v.9 and spend some time today in prayer confessing any sin you may need to bring forward to walk fully in the light.
